MON, 3/4, 4:47 AM	Officers investigated a report of a suspicious vehicle and person on the parking lot of North Glendale School, 765 N. Sappington Road. Upon arrival, no one or vehicle could be found on the parking lot or campus.
MON, 3/4, 8:28 AM	Officers provided traffic control for an auto transport truck delivering vehicles to Glendale Chrysler Jeep Dodge, 10070 Manchester Road.
MON, 3/4, 12:21 PM	A resident of the unit block of Southridge Court reported she was the victim of a scam. She reported that while performing a computer search for her financial institution, she received an alert on her computer from an unknown person stating, at first, they were with "Apple," then the Attorney General's Office, and finally a representative from "Bank of America." She said it appeared and sounded as if the person were the same each contact. They requested her "Apple ID" and told her that her computer's IP address had been hacked and they needed to give her a new one. She provided her "Apple ID," but then disconnected the call when she realized this was probably a scam and said she was going to contact the police. No financial losses were incurred. She was advised to notify her bank and the credit bureaus to watch for any suspicious activity.
MON, 3/4, 2:16 PM	A resident of the 800 block of Brownell Avenue turned over an unwanted firearm to the Police Department to be properly destroyed.

MON, 3/4, 2:33 PM North Glendale School officials reported an unknown male trespassing on the campus and refusing to leave when told to do so. Upon arrival, officers recognized the individual who was suffering a severe mental health crisis. Officers were able to de-escalate the situation and the man was conveyed to a local hospital for a mental health examination and treatment. As a precaution during the incident, school officials placed the school building on "lockout," which means no one enters or exits the building until police and school officials deem the area safe. Once the incident was de-escalated and the man was conveyed to a local hospital by ambulance, the "lockout" was released, and school dismissal occurred as scheduled without further incident.
