

STREETS & SIDEWALKS

S

Proposition S is an \$18.18 million bond issue that will fund needed improvements to streets, sidewalks, and stormwater systems across the city over 5 years. It will be on the ballot for the April 8, 2025 municipal election.

If approved, the bonds will finance:

- **33 street reconstruction projects and mill/overlay work on 6 additional streets to improve road quality and durability.**
- **Sidewalk repairs on 10 streets, new sidewalk construction on 3 streets, and the reconstruction of 8 ADA-compliant ramps to improve pedestrian safety and accessibility.**
- **Three stormwater improvement projects, selected from the City's Stormwater Master Plan, to mitigate flooding and enhance drainage in critical areas.**

A few key projects include:

- **Year 1 (2026):** Hill Drive and Greenview Drive reconstructions; Alexandra Avenue stormwater project.
- **Year 2 (2027):** Street and sidewalk repairs on Oakway Place and Hawbrook Road, Clif Side Drive stormwater improvements.
- **Year 3 (2028):** Street and sidewalk repairs on Cornelia Avenue and Austin Place.
- **Year 4 (2029):** New sidewalks on Alexandra Avenue and Venneman Avenue.
- **Year 5 (2030):** Reconstruction of key streets including Beverly Avenue and Elm Avenue.

April 8 Municipal Elections

Voter Registration:

- Register at stlouiscountymovotes.gov under “Voter Registration Application.”
- Applications can be submitted via email, mail, fax, or in-person.
- Registration ends **Thursday, March 13.**

Voter ID:

- Missouri Driver’s License or Non-Driver License
- U.S. Passport or Passport Card
- U.S. Military ID

If you have no form of identification but are a registered voter, you may cast a provisional ballot.

Absentee Ballots:

- Apply for an Absentee Ballot at stlouiscountymovotes.gov under “Absentee Application.”
- Applications due by **Wednesday, March 26.**
- No-excuse in-person absentee voting available with a valid form of ID.

Please note the following reminders and updates regarding the City’s solid waste service provider, Republic Services.

Republic Services encourages residents to report missed collections of trash, recycling and yard waste or other service issues to them directly at [\(636\) 947-5959](tel:6369475959).

Additionally, they ask that residents leave containers at the curb if a collection is missed so the truck can collect the material upon return service. Republic Services makes every effort to collect the missed items the next day, which is why it’s important to report missed collections to Republic as soon as possible.

The City encourages residents to sign up for utility bill autopay as a convenient alternative to checks and online accounts. Sign up through the City’s website, www.glendalemo.org, or at City Hall.

Spring Property Maintenance



Clean your gutters. Gutters direct rain away from your roof and home, protecting both in the process. Clogged gutters, meanwhile, open your home to water damage and there's a good chance you won't notice the damage until you need an expensive repair.

Clean decks, driveways, fences and other outside surfaces. A pressure washer makes this job easier. If you don't have one, borrow one from a neighbor or consider renting one from a home center. While you're cleaning, inspect for damage.

Repair any cracked or peeling paint. A good paint job makes your home look nice, while providing a protective barrier from the elements. Touch-up painting is easy to do and inexpensive.

Check seals around windows and doors. Winter weather can crack and harden caulk and other weather seals. Inspect them and repair or replace as needed. You'll reduce your air-conditioning bill and prevent water from entering your home and causing damage.

Clear vegetation around your AC compressor. To work efficiently, the compressor needs good airflow. To ensure it has breathing room, prune any plant growth that could block it.

Prepare your lawn mower for summer. Change the engine oil and sharpen the cutting blade; you'll lengthen the life of the mower and improve the look of your lawn.

Parks and Recreation Passes

The City of Glendale has partnered with the cities of Kirkwood and Webster Groves to provide recreation services to our residents. These partnerships enable Glendale residents to receive resident rates on a wide range of recreational memberships, programs, and activities.

Kirkwood Parks and Recreation

Glendale residents now receive resident access on everything at Kirkwood Parks and Recreation! This includes rates for rentals, memberships, and daily passes to all Kirkwood Parks and Recreation facilities including: the aquatic center, ice rink, community center, performing arts center and theater, outdoor fields and courts.

Glendale residents also get resident access and rates for all programs including: aquatic, sports, camps, and other general activities.

Important Note: Please note that for camp registrations, Glendale residents can register five business days after the opening of registration for Kirkwood residents. For pavilion rentals, Glendale residents can register 30 days after pavilion rentals open for Kirkwood residents, which is typically November 1 of each year.

Sign Up Instructions: Glendale residents will first need to get a Resident ID card from Kirkwood Parks and Recreation. Using this, residents will be able to sign up however they would like. For more information on Kirkwood facilities and programs, visit www.kirkwoodparksandrec.org.

Webster Groves Parks and Recreation

Glendale residents are also now able to receive resident rates for memberships at Webster Groves' recreational facilities. This includes the aquatic center, fitness center, ice rink, and tennis center.

Important Notes: The partnership applies to both daily use and annual memberships only. It excludes program/activity registrations and rentals of park pavilions, ice rink, meeting rooms and athletic fields.

Sign Up Instructions: Glendale residents will first need to get a Recreation Complex ID card from Webster Groves Parks and Recreation. Using this, residents will be able to sign up however they would like. For more information on Webster Groves and programs, visit www.webstergrovesmo.gov/643/Parks-Recreation.
