Mayor's Message

Q. *I have an old, historic house in Glendale, and I want to find out more about it. Can I get in touch with the Glendale Historical Society?*

Q. *What is going on with the broken electrical pole on Sappington, right by City Hall, that's just leaned up against the newer one?*

A. As of Wednesday, July 23, the pole has been removed by Ameren. It was not in danger of falling, but it could not be taken down until AT&T and Spectrum Communications removed their service lines from the pole.

Q. *Can residents request that the City Forester inspect trees on private property?*

A. The City Forester is used to assess the health of trees located in the public right-of-way and to assist the police department with code enforcement investigations. The City Forester is not able to provide personal inspections for residents of trees on their private property.

PROP S Progress & Updates

STREETS & SIDEWALKS

On June 16, 2025, the City entered into a contract with **Horner & Shifrin** for survey work, preliminary/final design development, and construction engineering related to the 2026 Prop S projects.

Below is the current completed surveying and next steps:

Survey work was completed on **Greenview Dr.** and the **700 block of Glenvista Pl.** between **June 26 and July 9.**

Following resident feedback, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen have decided **not to move forward** with sidewalk construction on **Alexandra Ave.** Though, stormwater survey work will still occur after the current round of surveys to inform potential future planning.

Survey work is scheduled on **Northarm Dr., Southarm Dr., Armstrong Dr., Halcyon Dr., and Hill Dr. (from E. Essex Ave. to Park Ave.)** from **July 28 to August 29.**

Once all survey work is complete, Horner & Shifrin will develop a **Preliminary Construction Plan**, which will be presented at a public open house (date TBD), allowing residents to review and provide feedback.

Final plans and bid documents are expected by **January 2026.** Then, the **bidding period** will take place in **February–March 2026.** **Construction** is currently scheduled for the **2026 construction season.**
